

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

2nd REGULAR SESSION

HCR 2040 – Measures would add a fee at the time of vehicle registration renewals to support State Parks and the Dept. of Transportation.

Stalled in House Appropriations

SB 1349 – Provides emergency procurement authority for State Parks to negotiate with private companies.

Passed Senate

SB 1370/HB 2786 – Would require State Parks to lease Lake Havasu State Park to Lake Havasu City for 25 years.

Died in Committee

HB 2060 diverts \$40 million from the Land Conservation Fund & gives \$35 million to ASP for operations and maintenance.

7TH SPECIAL SESSION 2010 BUDGET CHANGES

HB 2007 - Environment: Budget Reconciliation

For FY 2011, permits ASP to spend \$692,100 from Off Highway Vehicle Fund

For FY 2011, permits ASP to use LEBSF funds (@\$1.5 million) for operations.

For FY 2011, allows ASP to use all Enhancement Funds for operations.

HB 2012 - Revenues: Budget Reconciliation

For FY 2011 and thereafter, \$10 million annual deposits from Lottery to the Heritage Fund are eliminated.

All funds remaining in the Heritage Fund after June 30, 2011 will revert to the General Fund.


HCR 2002

Subject to voter approval, the entire balance in the Land Conservation Fund will be transferred to the General Fund which will result in at least \$1.5 million in lost revenue from interest earnings/operational dollars.




Enhancement Fund FY 2008-FY 2010 Revenue




State Lake Improvement Fund FY 2008-FY 2010 Revenue

HERITAGE FUND UPDATE Remaining FY 2010 Revenues Withheld

H.3.

Governor's Budget Office has instructed the Lottery to withhold Heritage Fund payments starting February 2010.

- ASP received \$6.1 million in FY 2010, \$3.9 million withheld
- Another \$1.5 million payment from Heritage Fund due to Dept. of Forestry on April 15.
- \$3.9 million in withheld revenues will mean a minimum shortfall of of \$700,000 for backfills in FY2010.
- HB 2012, 7th Special Session, eliminates Heritage Fund deposits in FY2011 and thereafter.






