During the January ASCOT meeting, the committee decided to offer the money through a “pre-paid package” that included what was eligible, what the committee wanted to offer, and the degree of need. Those applicants who receive the “pre-paid package” will contribute a 6% match. The committee will outline a proposal to present to the full ASCOT during their April 11, 2015 meeting.


E. NEXT MEETING DATE – The subcommittee will determine if a follow up meeting is needed.
