

FAQs

I don't know where to start or how a trail gets built or fixed?

- Parks staff will work with you throughout the grant to assist in helping you find the resources to complete a project.
- Parks works with three professional trail crews and they can come to your park to conduct an assessment to determine the level of work needed; cost; feasibility of project ideas. You can select these crews to build and fix trails, install signage.

What types of grants are available and is this cycle opened all year?

Are there matching requirements?

- It depends on the program –for non-motorized projects the match is 5.7%; motorized projects vary based on the program

How much funding is available?

- Approximately 2 million in dollars will be available to award selected projects.
- For competitive Non-motorized projects applicants can request up to \$80,000.
- For Trail Maintenance Program: \$30,000
- For competitive Motorized projects applicants can request up to \$750,000.
- For SEE: \$10,000

What are my chances of receiving a grant?

In the 2017 cycle, 35 out of 39 projects were funded.

Is this a reimbursement grant or does Parks provide a check up front?

- Non-motorized projects are all reimbursement grants. After your agency purchases and pays for an item you will submit those costs to Parks; it takes about 3 weeks to receive a check from Parks. Grantees can submit reimbursement costs often throughout the grant period.
- Depending on the source of funds motorized projects may be eligible to request advancement of funds.
